Mount St. Hilaire

Mount St. Hilaire is among the 10 most mineral rich sites in the world. The mineral riches of this area have a reputation of quality, quantity and diversity. Over 372 types of minerals, (over 50 were originally found there) have been found at the site. The most renowned is Serandite.

Mount St. Hilaire is one of 10 prominent hills, collectively called the Monteregian Hills.

The hills run West to East. They start with Oka (30 Km west of Montreal), Mount Royal, St. Bruno, St. Hilaire, Rougemont, Johnson, Yamaska, Shefford, Brome and Megantic (50 Km East of Sherbrooke) and 40 Km east of Montreal. Mt. St. Hilaire is only 4 Km in diameter and 400 m high. It appears higher because it protrudes above the flat plain of the St. Lawrence lowlands. The minerals found there are sought by collectors the world over.

Although Mt. St. Hilaire's shape makes it look like a volcano, it is not. Thhese hills were formed as a series of platonic intrusions in sedimentary bedrock. The unwellings of magma never broke the surface. The magma slowly cooled as a mass if igneous rocks surrounded by sedimentary bedrock. The minerals formed approximately 3 Km below the surface. The alkaline nature of the magma that formed the mountain contributed to the diversity of the minerals. Many of these minerals are considered rare. Millions of years of weathering and the scraping of ice has eroded the surrounding earth, leaving the Monteregian Hills exposed.

The Poudrette family obtained the property and the Poudrette Quarry began it's mining operation in 1954. Collectors enjoyed many field trips to the quarry and found many beautiful specimens. In 2008 the Poudrette Quarry was sold and all access to collectors came to a halt. Within the last year limited access to the quarry has been gained, to the delight of collectors.
