What Is Rust?.

Iron and most steels are unstable in the presence of moist oxygenated air. A spontaneous electrochemical reaction occurs in the thin film of surface moisture, resulting in erosion of the metal and the formation of a mixture of iron oxides. Rust usually contains a mixture of orange coloured lepidocrocite and black magnetite

A highly polished metal surface will resist rusting better than a rough surface because small pits and crevices trap the dust and moisture that promote rusting. Rust itself traps moisture and accelerates its own formation. Rusting is also promoted by the presence of salts or acid pollutants in the surrounding air.

Methods of Rust removal.

To remove rust one needs to dissolve it or loosen the strong bond between the rust and the underlying metal. Methods of rust removal fall into three main categories, mechanical, chemical and electrochemical. These methods differ in their aggressiveness, convenience, cost and appropriateness. I have found the electrochemical method to be the most useful one, but I often use a combined approach.

Mechanical Methods.

Mechanical methods break the bond between rust and metal by direct force. Harsher chemical methods remove rust by grinding or abrading with hard grits or blasting with sand or shot. Methods which scratch or actually remove some of the underlying metal should not be used on fine antique tools, but are suitable for heavy corroded used tools such as chisels or axes.

Both rigid grinding disks and flexible abrasion disks can be used in drills and angular grinders to remove severe corrosion and pitting. Buffing wheels and polishing compounds can then create a polished surface if desired.

Less severe mechanical methods include plastic bead blasting and wire brushing. Fine circular wire brushes used on power grinders and some of the newer non-metallic power scourer brushes can remove rust without damaging cast iron or hard steel. However both these types of brushes are costly to replace.

Rust removal with power tools can be laborious and hazardous, requiring protective gloves, dust mask, face shield and total concentration. For those reasons I generally favour the gentler non-mechanical methods of rust removal.
