I was reading in the news of a dam collapse in Brazil. I recall traveling through the area it happened in and when we went through there remarked to myself on the impact that the mining activities were having on the area; basically they had completely removed a mountain and placed the tailings in a huge tailing lake (i.e. 3km x 2 km with a depth of about 50m of tailings). It was this tailings lake that emptied down the valley and onto the unsuspecting town. If you wish to see the area it is very visible on Google Maps - search for "Bento Rodrigues - State of Minas Gerais, Brazil" - the mining area is to the NW of the town.

You may say - well what has this got to do with me? Actually a lot – it seems the companies operating in the area include Vale and Alcan so these are Canadian companies doing things in foreign countries they wouldn't be allowed to do here. As well the products produced from the materials mined are for consumer use.

I would like to encourage you to consider a few things – holding Canadian companies responsible as their actions abroad represent all Canadians – that the consumer goods we all use have a cost beyond what you pay at the checkout and that we need to perhaps look at reducing our appetites for them – and that as Rockhounds and mineral collectors we have a responsibility to behave well towards the Earth.

We only have one planet – we have to use it wisely!

Meteorite Excitement In Eastern Turkey

Villagers in eastern Turkey have earned more than one million lira (\$350,000; £230,000) from selling meteorite fragments which showered the area in September, it's reported. Local people in Saricicek, in Bingol province, are still scouring the fields around the village, and some have been able to buy cars or houses using the proceeds from their finds, **the Haberturk news website reports**. The meteorites can fetch up to \$60 (£40) a gram, according to the report.

The luckiest of the village's 3,200 residents could be Hasan Beldek, 30, who found a 1.5kg (3.3lb) chunk after being pestered to go searching by his mother-in-law. "I couldn't bear it any more so I went out and decided to give it a try," he tells the site. "I searched the area for three to four hours. Then a bright black stone larger than a man's fist looked right up at me."


Mr Beldek has already turned down offers of up to 350,000 lira (\$120,000; £80,000) for the rock, because he thinks it could fetch more. Any money he makes will be used to open a pastry shop in Istanbul with his brothers, he says.

A similar space-treasure hunt **gripped Russia's Chelyabinsk region** in 2013, after a huge meteor deposited fragments across a wide area before crashing into a lake. At the time, one scientist noted that while the minerals in the fragments are of no great scientific interest, large meteorites are still highly prized by researchers and collectors.
